

Funding Guidelines: FWF OA Publication Grant

1. Funding is available for open-access costs of peer-reviewed journal articles that result from FWF-funded projects handled by the University of Arts Linz.
2. All articles must follow the [Open Access Policy of the FWF](#).
3. Funding can be acquired for articles in:
 1. Open-access journals or platforms that are listed in the [Directory of Open Access Journals \(DOAJ\)](#). For the publication, the [“Creative Commons Attribution CC BY” license](#) (or an equivalent license) must be used in any case (in special cases, exceptions can be made for the [“CC BY-ND” license](#) if the FWF has granted its approval).¹
 2. Diamond-open-access platforms and alternative open-access platforms, if the publication is published with a “CC BY” licence and without embargo.
4. Upon submission, all publications must contain the following text:

“This research was funded in whole, or in part, by the Austrian Science Fund (FWF) [Grant DOI]. For the purpose of open access, the author has applied a CC BY public copyright licence to any Author Accepted Manuscript version arising from this submission.”²

5. The “corresponding author” is part of the University of Arts Linz and submits the funding application.
6. In any case, the publication is published under the [Creative-Commons-BY-Lizenz \(CC BY\)](#).
7. There is no legal claim for funding.
8. In the final report to the FWF, any open-access activities as well as the compliance with the open-access policy must be documented. This is achieved through a Persistent Identifier, with which the full text of the publication can be accessed, read, and downloaded.

No funding is available for:

1. Open-access fees for peer-reviewed monographs, entire anthologies, entire special issues, or e-books. For works like these, the FWF offers the [Book Publications](#) funding program.
2. Costs for delayed or belated open-access of a publication.
3. Reimbursements for already paid invoices of APCs or CPCs.
4. Other charges or fees connected to the publication, such as cover charges, color charges, page charges, etc.
5. "Hybrid" open access.
6. Publications under licenses other than CC BY.
7. Costs for reading access.
8. Costs for managing the open-access costs (e.g. personnel expenses).
9. Costs for activities that fall within the scope of the normal business operations of the funded institution.

Funding Procedure

1. Informally contact the Art.Research|PhD department via kunst.forschung@kunstuni-linz.at and inform them about your publication project (name of the journal, article title, estimated costs).
2. The Art.Research|PhD department will let you know if there are still sufficient funds available to finance this project using the OAP-package allocation. Otherwise, you will be referred to other funding possibilities.
3. If the Art.Research|PhD department approves a submission through the OAP-channel, fill out the application form and send it to kunst.forschung@kunstuni-linz.at.
4. The Art.Research|PhD department reviews the application and notifies you if the costs will be covered.
5. Submit the article, including [acknowledgement](#) and copyright information as well as the invoice address, to the publisher.
6. The publisher sends the invoice to the Open-Access Office. If the publisher can only send the invoice directly to the author, please forward us the invoice so we can pay. **Do NOT pay the invoice yourself!**

Please note: The invoice must contain a clear connection to the published article, e.g. through a clear identifier or the article title. The invoice address must be the following: Open-Access-Office, Abteilung

For information purposes only. The German version of these guidelines shall prevail in all respects.

7. The Open-Access Office pays the invoice to the publisher and informs you.
After a funded publication is published, it will be archived in [Phaidra](#) through the Open-Access Office.

Please Note:

Publication costs which you have already paid *cannot* be reimbursed.
