"is this darkness in you too"

is a project by the Video Art & Performance seminar group of Phil Collins & Tobias Yves Zintel. Taking to the streets from Columbiadamm to Südtern and Mehringdamm the students from Cologne will engage with communities and individuals who live and work adjacent to the Floating University. "is this darkness in you too" brings together the neighbourhood with art students in pairs or duos which will explore everyday life in the area, and experience the highs and lows of collaborative practices as the project's main aim. Protagonists ranging from policewomen and men, to graveyard gardeners, night club owners, long distance lorry drivers and the manager of a refugee-run gym, speak to the interconnected contradictions of coexistence in the vicinity of the former Airport Tempelhof, reflecting through encounters and exchanges on the purpose of the university itself.

In the 2018 summer semester, architecture students of the Nuremberg Institute of Technology will create an identity for a site in Berlin, located between the former Tempelhof airfield and the Südtern public transport hub. The students will research relevant topics including available infrastructure and natural resources. They will develop related strategies for a point of origin for their design projects with a focus on new forms of living in the city and its complex web of material and energy flows. The design project is divided into three phases: research in Nuremberg with professors of Floating University and external experts on the history and future of the site; urban research on site within four workshops in cooperation with Kunsthochschule Linz and ENSA Nantes; design and final crit in Berlin.

An excursion day will be followed by a workshop of 2-3 days duration. Through a systematic sequence of questions, the participants will be enabled to 'download' their knowledge, building a situation analysis of the rainwater basin and adjacent gardens. We will see a conceptual model growing to several meters length that reflects the complex web of causes and effects influencing the local ecosystems and social systems and the services they provide. The conceptual model will embrace all stresses the systems are experiencing, and the human activities behind them. Ideas arising from work at the Floating University in the following months can then be mapped into the conceptual model and thus put into perspective.
